REPRIEVE FOR BOULDERS

It's good news that the City Council has listened to local residents and decided not to issue Environmental an Protection Notice requiring the removal of the boulders on the track leading to Owlstone Croft. The Council had been asked to remove the stones by Queens' College to clear the way for construction vehicles but they are needed to protect the trees and plants on the verge and slow down traffic on the blind bend.

ENVIRONMENT AGENCY OVERRULED ON PLANS

The huge growth in this region is harming our chalk streams through over-abstraction, and the Environment Agency has objected to major developments because there is not enough water.

Planners have recently decided to give the go-ahead anyway for science parks and offices, including at West Cambridge, on the basis that a Water Scarcity Group has now been set up and is developing socalled 'water credits'. This is unproven as a solution - similar carbon credit schemes have failed in many cases,

Approval for these plans comes despite a report showing we have enough lab and office space in Cambridge.
